


42% of responses chose inflation and economic problems as the major problem facing the US.

34% of responses chose a lack of confidence in leaders and Watergate.


 $\frac{46\%}{}$ of Republicans and $\frac{39\%}{}$ of Democrats selected inflation.

26% of Republicans selected lack of confidence in leaders and Watergate, compared to 38% of Democrats.

Completed 601 face-to-face interviews with lowans from July 19-23, 1974.

Asked over 50 questions about Iowa politics, international issues, healthcare, and media.










Wallace led among those with less than a high school education, while Kennedy led among voters with a high school diploma or some college.

Ford was most popular among lower-income voters, while Reagan performed best among higher-income voters.

Inflation and Wages



of respondents reported that their wages and salaries had not kept pace with inflation.

20% of Republicans blamed the government for inflation, compared to 6 of Democrats and 22% of Independents.

More than half didn't offer an estimate for the current yearly inflation rate.

Among those who provided an estimate, thought inflation was 20% or more, estimated it at 10-11%.
